



Specific rules for the Master's programmes taught in English

A series of specific rules have been stipulated for the Master's programme taught in English and serves as exemptions to the curriculum of the ordinary master's programme. The rules apply to foreign full degree students who do not hold a bachelor from the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts, School of Architecture, or Aarhus School of Architecture.

1. Admission requirements

One may apply for the following two Master's Programmes, respectively accommodating up to 10 foreign degree students:

- Architecture in Urban context (study department 2)
- Design in architectural contexts (study department 11)

Students with a Bachelor's degree or the equivalent from a state-recognised school of architecture may apply and are eligible for admission if their qualifications are assessed as being comparable to the Danish entrance qualifications.

The admission board will assess students eligible for admission based on their academic qualifications. The board arranges the applications in order of priority. All decisions made by the admission board are final.

2. Language

All in-class instruction, lectures, seminars, compendia, semester reviews, graduation etc. at the Master's programme are conducted in English.

Students, who are offered a study place at the Master's programmes, are required to verify their English proficiency by submitting a language test that meets the minimum requirements set by the school, i.e. TOEFL paper based - 550, TOEFL internet based - 80, IELTS - 6.0.

Language tests are not required for Scandinavian students if they have English on B-level or the equivalent from qualifying exam (documentation required).

Students who have earned their full Bachelor's degree in English are also exempted (documentation required).

3. Inter-departmental transfers

Foreign students may only transfer to a department with a Master's programmes taught in English, department 2 or 11, unless they can prove Danish proficiency, i.e. the government controlled "Studieprøven i dansk som andetsprog for voksne" or equivalent tests. Native speakers in a Scandinavian language may transfer to any department at school.
